Key consideration management of large numbers of burnt patients in resource-limited environments. The key differences with a mass burns event. Includes: a) Burns management (dressing) b) Fluid management challenges c) Management of expectant d) Clinical management differences? e) What are the controversies? f) Pain management? Masterclass: Clinical Management considerations and key interventions at a district / rural hospital level
